

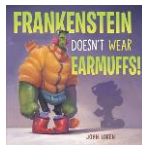

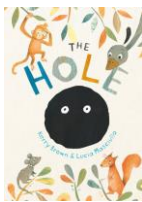

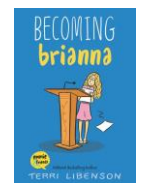
When Pugtato digs up a strange object in his garden, he enlists his best "spuddies" to help figure out just what this Thing is.
